I. YOU ARE ACCEPTABLE

A. Many times we are rejected by people including:

B. What determines the value of something?

1. It depends on what someone is willing to pay for it.

III. YOU ARE CAPABLE

A. In the Old Testament only priests had the privilege to go directly to God. In the New Testament you have the right and responsibility to go directly to God.
